On average, we are called to three potentially lifesaving missions daily, both in our helicopter and critical care cars.

We are called out to all kinds of emergencies, from road traffic collisions to cardiac arrests, child-related emergencies to horse-riding and cycling injuries.

**We need to raise £5m a year to continue our lifesaving service.
This works out at over £13,000 a day.**

**We have been providing a critical care service by
land and air since 1990.**



**We became a stand alone service in 2015 and moved into
our purpose built airbase in Semington in 2018.**

**We receive no regular direct funding from the
Government or National Lottery grants.**



**We operate up to 19 hours a day, 365 days a year.
We are one of 12 air ambulances who are able to fly at night.**

**On average, we are called to three
missions every day.**



**Speed is our superpower – from our airbase in Semington, we can reach
anywhere in Wiltshire and Bath in just 11 minutes.**

The power of online giving

Unsure where to start or how to set up your online giving page?

Our simple tips will help you get your pages set up. If you need any additional help setting up your page, please do get in touch.



Add a profile photo

Making your page personalised will help you connect with your supporters more. It also helps friends and family searching for your page identify they have the right one.



Don't forget your target

A target gives yourself and your supporters something to work towards. Fundraisers who add a target to their page may see an increase in the amount raised.



Update your supporters

Uploading regular updates in the lead up to your event updates your supporters on your fundraising journey. On some platforms, you can also connect Strava/FitBit to your account to share your maps and mileage with your supporters during your training.



How to boost your fundraising

There are numerous ways to boost your fundraising to help us go above and beyond for those who need us most.

Spread the word

We can supply short videos and photos to help people understand why you - and we - need their support. Don't forget to tag us in your social posts, we love to see what our supporters are up to!

Talk to nearby businesses

They may be able to help with sponsorship or prizes for raffles or auctions. Your workplace may also be able to help by match-funding any funds you raise.

Connect with local newspapers and radio stations

This can help to expand the reach of your fundraising. Use their platforms to spread the word and gain wider community support.

Organise cost-effective impactful events

Bake sales and team fun days at work are impactful. Creating an exciting atmosphere that encourages participation can help to boost donations.

Talk about your story

If you're asking for sponsorship, tell people how you are feeling. Your friends and family will respond better if you tell them about your experiences.

Fundraising Materials

How your support helps us

£17

One ventilator circuit

Disposable breathing circuit, providing the connection between the patient and the mechanical ventilator.



£25

OLAES trauma bandage

An advanced bandage used for the management of severe haemorrhage.



£45

Blizzard blankets

Blizzard blankets are extensively used in the HEMS (Helicopter Emergency Medical Service) and military environment. They are lightweight, wind and waterproof making them ideal to keep a casualty dry and warm.



£100

MEQU - blood products

Warms up blood from cold to body temperature within seconds, making it safe to give to the patient.



£300

Intra-osseous access device

Provides critical vascular access for fluid or drug therapy when traditional intravenous access is unable to be gained.



Ways to bank your fundraising

Once you have finished your fundraising efforts there are several ways you can bank your fundraising:

Fundraising page

If you have set up a fundraising page with JustGiving, GivenGain or Enthuse, your funds will automatically be transferred to us. You don't need to take any further action other than ensuring that your page closes following the event.

In person

If you would like to pay in funds in person, please contact the Charity team to arrange a time to drop off your donation at our airbase in Semington.

Bank transfer

Please contact the Charity office to obtain our bank details. When sending your funds, please reference your payment accordingly.

Online

You can use our website to pay in your fundraising, scan the QR code which will take you to our website. Please provide as much information as possible so we can ensure we thank the appropriate people.

By Cheque

Cheques should be payable to Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity. You can post your cheque with a covering letter to our Charity office (please include your name, address and how the funds were raised). Please do not send cash in the post.

Your safety and the law

There are legal requirements for some fundraising methods such as raffles and street collections. If you are planning a fundraising event please do let us know and we can give you all the relevant information.

Your safety is far more important than money, so whatever you do to raise funds, please don't put yourself at risk. Above all, enjoy it – your enthusiasm will catch on! For more information, please visit the Fundraising Regulator by scanning the QR code.

How do I claim Gift Aid?

As a Charity, we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated by individuals. Simply ask your supporters to fill in their full name and address details on a sponsorship form or tick the box when making a donation online.

How do I organise a raffle?

All raffles fall under strict laws. There are some cases where a license from your local council may be required. Please have a look at the Fundraising Regulator website and refer to the Gambling Commission's regulations.

FAQS

Can you add my event to your website?

We love to hear from our wonderful fundraisers about the work they are doing to support us. Please do get in touch to let us know about any events you may have planned.

We can then ensure we support you with anything you need from us. You can request to have your event listed on our website, please do email us with your event information and any posters or links to your event or fundraising page.

Am I allowed to use your logo on posters/leaflets I've made to advertise my event?

If you are fundraising for us you can use our 'in aid of' or our 'proudly supporting' logo, please get in touch and we will happily provide you with the necessary artwork files.

Can I organise an event for Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity and another charity jointly?

Yes, as long as you let your supporters know the money is being split, and between which charities.
